## **Annual report 2019 Omogolo Wildlife Trust**

#### <u>General</u>

Omogolo Wildlife Trust continued its growth in 2019 and increased the total of donations with 40% compared to the year before. Most donations have been transferred to the animal projects and a part has been reserved for Emergency Animal rescue purposes, allowing us to react swiftly when we get a call for support.

Our certification by CBF (Centraal Bureau Fondsenwerving) was re-approved again.

After having participated in the 'Campagne Nalaten' (Inheritance awareness campaign) for the last few years, we now had to decide to end our membership, due to the high costs involved that are unproportionate to our income. We are proud to have been one of the charities involved in the early stages of the campaign and we believe that the campaign has been successful in increasing awareness and interest of Dutch donors to include charities in their will.

Our Board has committed itself again to pay for <u>all</u> the running costs of the Trust, allowing us to send 100% of our incoming donations to the animal projects that we support.

### **Fundraising**

We continued our fundraising activities via our social media sites <a href="https://www.omogolowildlife.org">www.omogolowildlife.org</a> and <a href="https://www.facebook.com/omogolowildlife.">www.facebook.com/omogolowildlife.</a>

Various fundraising events, organized by schools and clubs, with Omogolo Wildlife Trust as beneficiary, brought in big donations for our projects.

In total more than 24,000 Euros was received as donations, a 40% increase compared to our last book year and 20% more than planned.

A breakdown of the donations transferred to the projects is shown below. Remaining donations ( $\in$  2,800) were donations made by Board members to cover for running costs and (international) bank fees.
