### **Annual report 2022 Omogolo Wildlife Trust**

#### General

2022 brought us an end to the COVID-19 pandemic. For Omogolo Wildlife Trust, and for the projects that we support, this brought hope for restoration of our incoming donations. We all have a difficult time behind us, however, we are optimistic for the future and we thank our donors for their continued support!

We passed our annual certification of CBF (Centraal Bureau Fondsenwerving), needed to maintain our ANBI status, and allowing our donors to deduct their gifts to us from the income tax.

Our Board has committed itself again to work on a non-paid basis and to pay for bank fees and <u>all</u> other running costs of the Trust, ensuring that 100% of our incoming donations arrive on the accounts of the animal projects that we support.

### Fundraising

We are also included in several fundraising platforms, amongst which Geef.nl and Benevity.

Our incoming donations grew with 20% compared to our last book year, for which we are very grateful. Our regular donors didn't let us down – even despite Corona!
