### 1 COMPILATION REPORT

#### **Audit**

In accordance with your instructions we have compiled the annual account 2022 of the foundation, including the balance sheet totals of € 450,598 and the statement of revenue and expenditure with a result of € 302,802.

### Management's responsibility

The distinctive feature of a compilation engagement is that we compile financial information based on information provided by management of your foundation. Management is responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the information provided and the financial statements based thereon.

### Confirmation

Based on the information provided to us, we have compiled the financial statements using the accounting policies as included in generally accepted principles for financial reporting in the Netherlands.



### 2 GENERAL

#### 2.1 Foundation

The activities of Stichting United Way The Netherlands relate mainly to the improvement of economic, social and cultural conditions by improving the quality of life of people and their communities. The foundation is a so called Algemeen Nut Beoogde Instelling (ANBI) at a non-profit basis.

### 2.2 Board

On December 31, 2022 the members of the Board are P.M. Weiss (chairman), S.C. van Groningen (secretary), Mrs. J.M. van Karnebeek-Thijssen (treasurer), Mrs. H.M.C. Hulsebosch and V.W. van Gogh. The members of the Board of the foundation are unpaid.

### 2.3 Foundation of the foundation

By notarial deed of 2019 January 15th, notary Mr. Alexander Stuijt in Haarlem, the foundation was founded as Stichting United Way The Netherlands. Activities are starting that date in name of and for risk of the foundation.

## 2022 Financial Report

This annual report provides information about the performance, financial and otherwise, of United Way the Netherlands (UW-NL), in compliance with the norms and standards set by United Way Worldwide. At the outset we wish to thank our donors, partners and volunteers for the trust they place in us.

### **Donations**

- During 2022, UW-NL succeeded in raising €833.868, almost tripling the amount raised during the previous year. Large donors included the Internet Society Foundation, Oranje Fonds, the UEFA Foundation for Children, Kansfonds, TotalEnergies, Cellnex and Salesforce. An important contribution was made by United Way Worldwide, from funds raised through its global network to support our work with Ukrainian refugees. HP made an in-kind donation of 100 laptops, with an approximate value of €50.000,-
- Following our successful implementation of our "Joining Forces" project together with UW Spain, the Internet Society Foundation (ISOF) decided to extend and enlarge its donation for another year, now to also include Romania, Germany, the UK and Israel.
- We have continued our efforts to raise funds among individuals, showing partial results during 2022 but a strong pipeline (partly already materialized) for 2023.

## Community Impact

2022 saw a continuation of our COVID related work, however quickly overshadowed by the war in Ukraine. The flexibility of our team coupled with the generosity of our donors allowed us to quickly react to these new circumstances and implement the projects we mention below.

- Based on the input provided by Ukrainian Women Refugees, our "Home away from Home" project was set up, offering diverse activities out of four different locations. These included language courses in Dutch and English, housing and employment support, a kids club, yoga and in general, a place where refugee women could meet and exchange concerns and experiences. This led to the creation of the Ukraine Refugee Women Association.
- Mental health support was identified as a key issue for both Ukrainian women and their children. During 2022, we started a pilot project engaging four Ukrainian counsellors with degrees in psychology and psychiatry, offering coaching and mentoring to over 60 beneficiaries. Following very positive reviews, we are scaling up this initiative into 2023 also in locations beyond Amsterdam. This project was endorsed by Prof. dr. Rutger Engels of the Erasmus University Rotterdam, and Rhodia Maas, Director General of the IND.

- The continuation of our "Joining Forces" program meant that during 2022, 150 elderly were brought in contact with 100 (migrant) volunteers, through the use of tablets and laptops, mitigating loneliness, giving participants a sense of purpose and enhancing integration.
- We also continued to support our "Get a Grip" project to improve youth financial literacy, as well as the IMC weekend school with inspiration based lessons for migrant children.
- Part of the funds raised during 2022 will allow us to continue supporting these projects during 2023.

### Partners and Volunteers

- We are extremely grateful to have been able to count on an increased number of partners and volunteers during 2022. Special mention goes to the Van Gogh Museum, the Anne Frank House, Combiwel, Humanitas and Saffier for their ongoing support. Countless volunteers provided approximately 2000 hours of support, an all-time high.
- The generosity of our donors has allowed us to further build our capacity and infrastructure, improve our website and seek the certifications needed to access diverse pools of funds.

It is our pleasure to present this annual report to you.

## 3 NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

## **GENERAL**

### Registered office, legal form and registration number at the chamber of commerce

The registered and actual address of Stichting United Way The Netherlands is Keizersgracht 370C,in Amsterdam. It is registered at the chamber of commerce under number 73715158.

### GENERAL ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES FOR THE PREPARATION OF THE ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

The financial statements are using the accounting policies as included in generally accepted principles for financial reporting in the Netherlands.

Valuation of assets and liabilities and determination of the result takes place under the historical cost convention. Unless presented otherwise at the relevant principle for the specific balance sheet item, assets and liabilities are presented at nominal value.

Income and expenses are accounted for on accrual basis. Revenues are only included when realized on the balance sheet date. Expenses originating before the end of the financial year are taken into account if they have become known before preparation of the financial statements.

Revenues from goods are recognised upon delivery. The expenses of these goods is allocated to the same period. Revenues from services are recognised in proportion to the services rendered. The expenses of these services are allocated to the same period.

### ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES APPLIED TO THE VALUATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

### Tangible fixed assets

A provision has been recognised for costs of periodical major maintenance. This provision is presented under the other provisions as a liability item.

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised if the economic ownership held by the foundation is governed by a financial lease agreement. The commitment arising from the financial lease agreement is accounted for as a liability. The interest included in the future lease instalments is charged to the result over the term of the financial lease agreement.

#### **Securities**

Securities are registered at nominal value.

### Cash and cash equivalents

The cash is valued at face value. If cash equivalents are not freely disposable, then this has been taken into account in the valuation.

#### **Current liabilities**

On initial recognition current liabilities are recognised at fair value. After initial recognition current liabilities are recognised at the amortised cost price.



## **ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES FOR THE DETERMINATION OF THE RESULT**

#### Determination of the result

The result is determined based upon the difference between the revenue and expenditure and other expenses taking into account the aforementioned valuation principles.

### **Employee benefits**

### General

Employee expenses (wages, salaries, social security contributions, etc.) are presented as a separate item in the statement of expenses.

### Financial income and expenses

### Interest income and interest expenses

Interest income and expenses are recognised on a pro rata basis, taking account of the effective interest rate of the assets and liabilities to which they relate. In accounting for interest expenses, the recognised transaction expenses for loans received are taken into consideration.

### Currency translation differences

Currency translation differences arising upon the settlement or conversion of monetary items are recognised in the income statement in the period that they are realised, unless hedge accounting is applied.
