1 COMPILATION REPORT

Based on the information provided to us, we have compiled the financial statements using the accounting policies as included in generally accepted principles for financial reporting in the Netherlands.



2 GENERAL

2.1 Foundation

The activities of Stichting United Way The Netherlands relate mainly to the improvement of economic, social and cultural conditions by improving the quality of life of people and their communities. The foundation is a so called Algemeen Nut Beoogde Instelling (ANBI) at a non-profit basis.

2.2 Board

On December 31, 2023 the members of the Board are P.M. Weiss (chairman), S.C. van Groningen (secretary), Mrs. J.M. van Karnebeek-Thijssen (treasurer) and V.W. van Gogh. The members of the Board of the foundation are unpaid.

2.3 Foundation of the foundation

By notarial deed of 2019 January 15th, notary Mr. Alexander Stuijt in Haarlem, the foundation was founded as Stichting United Way The Netherlands. Activities are starting that date in name of and for risk of the foundation.

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2023 Financial Report

This annual report provides information about the performance, financial and otherwise, of United Way the Netherlands (UW-NL) in 2023, in compliance with the norms and standards set by United Way Worldwide. At the outset, we wish to thank our donors, partners, and volunteers for the trust they place in us.

Donations

During 2023, UW-NL succeeded in raising €571.690.

Large donors included the Internet Society Foundation, Orange Fonds, Total Energies, Salesforce, Cellnex and UEFA. An important contribution was also made by United Way Worldwide, from funds raised through its global network to support our work with Ukrainian refugees.

During the year, we also managed to increase substantially the funds raised from individual donors.

While we continue being successful in partnering with international companies working in The Netherlands in support of the communities they operate in, our efforts will increasingly focus on expanding our reach to locally based corporates, foundations and individuals.

As a relatively young organization in The Netherlands, we still have quite a bit of work to do to increase our name recognition with all relevant stakeholders. We trust that the impact our past and present projects are having on the segments of the community we are addressing as well as our global presence going back 130 years, will help us in this respect.

Community Impact

In reviewing our community impact during 2023, UW-NL acknowledges the complexities of operating in an ever-changing landscape, particularly amidst the ongoing challenges posed by the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. Despite these challenges, UW-NL maintained its flexibility, innovative creativity and quick response capabilities, to try to address these challenges as there arise, while also not losing sight of and support to our existing projects.

Following our pilot during 2022, the "Healing the Mind" project emerged as a cornerstone initiative in 2023, playing an instrumental role in delivering accessible and culturally sensitive mental support services to Ukrainian refugees in The Netherlands. Through tailored counselling sessions and comprehensive support mechanisms, UW-NL proactively addressed the emotional distress and trauma experienced by refugees, fostering resilience, and facilitating their integration into Dutch society. The success of this project is being increasingly recognized by Dutch municipalities who are looking to partner with us in their geographical areas.

Moreover, alongside the pivotal role of the Healing the Mind project, UW-NL's Ukrainian Women Refugees Association (UWRA), contributed significantly to the organization's mission in 2023. Particularly noteworthy were the diverse language classes offered by UWRA, providing Ukrainian refugees with essential linguistic skills, and facilitating their communication and integration within the local community.

UW-NL other flagship operation, Project Joining Forces, included more than 350 elderly in seven different locations across the country.

During 2023, we also continued to support isolated elderly in our joining forces project offering specially configurated tablets. Matching children with a migration background with volunteer workers from Salesforce and Cellnex in our "learning for life" project gained increasing interest amongst corporate donors thus continuing in 2024.

In summary, UW-NL continues to demonstrate its unwavering dedication to serving vulnerable segments of the community and fostering positive societal change.

Partners and volunteers

We are extremely grateful to have been able to count on an increased number of partners and volunteers during 2023. Special mention goes to the Van Gogh Museum and members of "de Toqueville society". Countless volunteers provided 5000 hours of support to our various projects.

The generosity of our donors has allowed us to further build our capacity, infrastructure and to run pilots that have developed into sustainable projects.

It is our pleasure to present this annual report to you.

3 NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

GENERAL

Registered office, legal form and registration number at the chamber of commerce

The registered and actual address of Stichting United Way The Netherlands is Keizersgracht 370C,in Amsterdam. It is registered at the chamber of commerce under number 73715158.

GENERAL ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES FOR THE PREPARATION OF THE ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

The financial statements are using the accounting policies as included in generally accepted principles for financial reporting in the Netherlands.

Valuation of assets and liabilities and determination of the result takes place under the historical cost convention. Unless presented otherwise at the relevant principle for the specific balance sheet item, assets and liabilities are presented at nominal value.

Income and expenses are accounted for on accrual basis. Revenues are only included when realized on the balance sheet date. Expenses originating before the end of the financial year are taken into account if they have become known before preparation of the financial statements.

Revenues from goods are recognised upon delivery. The expenses of these goods is allocated to the same period. Revenues from services are recognised in proportion to the services rendered. The expenses of these services are allocated to the same period.

ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES APPLIED TO THE VALUATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

Tangible fixed assets

A provision has been recognised for costs of periodical major maintenance. This provision is presented under the other provisions as a liability item.

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised if the economic ownership held by the foundation is governed by a financial lease agreement. The commitment arising from the financial lease agreement is accounted for as a liability. The interest included in the future lease instalments is charged to the result over the term of the financial lease agreement.

Securities are registered at nominal value.

Cash and cash equivalents

The cash is valued at face value. If cash equivalents are not freely disposable, then this has been taken into account in the valuation.

Current liabilities

On initial recognition current liabilities are recognised at fair value. After initial recognition current liabilities are recognised at the amortised cost price.



ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES FOR THE DETERMINATION OF THE RESULT

Determination of the result

The result is determined based upon the difference between the revenue and expenditure and other expenses taking into account the aforementioned valuation principles.

Employee benefits

General

Employee expenses (wages, salaries, social security contributions, etc.) are presented as a separate item in the statement of expenses.

Financial income and expenses

Interest income and interest expenses

Interest income and expenses are recognised on a pro rata basis, taking account of the effective interest rate of the assets and liabilities to which they relate. In accounting for interest expenses, the recognised transaction expenses for loans received are taken into consideration.

Currency translation differences

Currency translation differences arising upon the settlement or conversion of monetary items are recognised in the income statement in the period that they are realised, unless hedge accounting is applied.
